# What Is Palm Sunday?

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday, which is the beginning of what Christians for centuries have called Holy Week. On this day we remember that Jesus, knowing that he would die, turned toward Jerusalem to confront his future on our behalf. We wave palms as crowds did for Jesus, welcoming him as king. We praise Jesus today, but our praise is tempered with the reality that in the coming days we remember these same crowds turned to yell, "Crucify him!" Along with Christians throughout the world, we will walk with Je sus this week as he makes his journey to the cross. Then, next week, on Easter, we will offer unfettered praise to Jesus, raised from the dead and reigning in glory.

# Let's Welcome Rev. Elizabeth Wagner!

Our guest preacher today is the Rev. Elizabeth Wagner. Liz spent thirty years as a CPA in corporate accounting in Charlotte, NC before being called to the ministry. After graduating from Union Presbyterian Seminary at Charlotte, Rev. Wagner served as the Associate Pastor at the Presbyterian Church of Bella Vista, Arkansas, and then as the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Logan, OH. The Wagners moved to Philadelphia several years ago when Liz's husband Jim accepted the position of Business Administrator for the Presbytery of Philadelphia. Liz and Jim live in center city, blocks away from their two sons, daughters-in-law and "grand-pets".

Liz had hoped to restart her final project in the Doctor of Ministry Program at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, but God had other plans for her. The first surprise was the opportunity to serve as Director of Finance at Wayne Presbyterian Church. A year later she was called by them back into pastoral ministry, guiding the time of transition as Wayne Presbyterian sought a new head of staff. Ministry at Wayne Presbyterian Church was followed by another Director of Finance contract with OIC Philadelphia.

Liz serves on the Commission on Ministry (COM) of the Presbytery of Philadelphia, and is the moderator of the Southeast region, in which ASPC is located. Until recently, Liz was the liaison from the COM to Arch Street. We are delighted to welcome Liz to the ASPC pulpit.
